Death will be no more; mourning and crying and pain will be no more, for the first things have passed away." ⁵ And the one who was seated on the throne said, "See, I am making all things new." They said to him, "Lord, come and see." ³⁵ Jesus began to weep. ³⁶ So the Jews said, "See how he loved him!" ³⁷ But some of them said, "Could not he who opened the eyes of the blind man have kept this man from dying?" ³⁸ Then Jesus, again greatly disturbed, came to the tomb. 





All are welcome to receive the wine and bread at our Lord's table. Grape Juice is in pre-poured glasses and gluten-free wafers are available on the tables as you come forward.



Reducing Food Waste Lunch & Competition

On Sunday, November 10, following the worship service, all are invited to lunch in the social hall. We'll follow up on our earlier workshops about reducing the amount of food that we waste. Reducing the amount of food that we discard is an easy way we can help to limit greenhouse emissions causing climate change.

It's a potluck! Try using food that might otherwise go to waste. If you can't make something, don't worry; there will be plenty.

If you want, enter your dish in the Chopped Competition. Unlike the TV version, we won't be whipping up three courses in front of the judges in a ridiculously short time. Here are our more relaxed rules:

- 1) Make just one dish—anything from appetizer to dessert.
- 2) Use ingredients that satisfy at least two of these criteria:
 - a. something that is nearing its expiration date
 - b. something that has been languishing in the refrigerator or freezer
 - c. something that is leftover
 - d. something that you overbought

Read: Read the key verse from Sunday's reading.

Reflect: Reflect on the scripture summary.

When Jesus saw how the death of Lazarus brought about great sorrow among his friends and his sisters, Martha and Mary, Jesus was disturbed, and he wept with them. Jesus then went to the tomb and raised Lazarus to life so that the crowd could believe in him.

- What was the last funeral you attended? What part of the service was the most moving?
- For the littles: What makes you sad? It's okay to cry when you're sad! Even Jesus did!
